**Spanish Tragedy**



Our only monument in Spain is in the Port of Barcelona. It commemorates the tragic night of 17 January 1977. Both the USS Guam and the USS Trenton were anchored in the outer harbor, and the sailors and Marines were being shuttled to shore and back on liberty boats. A 56-foot launch carrying 130 Americans was run into by the 380 ton Spanish freighter “Urbea” at 2:30 am, just as it was rounding the pier to head back to the ship. The launch overturned and 49 of the 130 seaman drowned in the murky waters. Some seaman were able to swim to shore. Some were trapped under the capsized vessel for hours, breathing in a 1-1/2 foot space until Spanish tugboats could right the stricken craft. Over 30 were hospitalized, some with serious injuries. A year later, on 18 January 1978, a monument was dedicated commemorating the fallen and to thank the Barcelona rescuers for their role in helping the US Navy.
